Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a certified first responder or licensed EMT or paramedic must renew the credential every July 1 of even-numbered years. While not subject to an initial licensing or renewal fee, Wisconsin EMS personnel can be assessed fees for late renewal, reinstatement, and manual processing as opposed to electronic processing. The current EMS License system was established to provide an initial/renewal licensure for EMS providers and services in the State of Wisconsin ever two years, and currently licenses 17,000 providers and 800 EMS services. These totals include in and out of state providers needing licensure for active EMS healthcare professionals in the State.

Under SB 28, the approval of this bill will require all applications within the Department's E-Licensing system to be updated from a two year to four year period. The cost of the software application updates would be \$60,000 GPR. Associated curriculum would have to be updated to account for the new licensing time, in addition to changes to forms and training modules. A Training Coordinator LTE would be able to make the required updates for a one-time cost of \$31,400 GPR.

With the extension of the licensing period, fees assessed for late renewal and reinstatement will likely be halved. On average, the program earns \$30,000 PR in fee revenue each year. Therefore, with this change, the average annual revenue will drop to \$15,000 PR.

This bill will not have a fiscal impact on local health departments.
