Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Current law prohibits individuals from manufacturing, distributing, or delivering marijuana; possessing marijuana with the intent to manufacture, distribute, or deliver; and possessing or attempting to possess drug paraphernalia with the intent to produce, distribute, or use a controlled substance.

This bill creates a medical use defense against prosecution and forfeiture actions for individuals and their primary caregivers who register with the Department of Health Services (DHS) as having a debilitating medical condition or treatment. Under the bill, individuals who possess a valid registration identification card would be protected from marijuana-related arrest or prosecution, provided certain criteria are met. They include possessing no more than a statutorily defined amount; forgoing the operation of a motor vehicle or conduct endangering the health or well-being of others; and forgoing use on school busses, public transit, or school premises. The bill requires DHS to establish a registry for individuals; provide identification cards provided statutorily thresholds are met; license and regulate dispensaries to facilitate use; and promulgate rules allowing entities to grow and distribute marijuana to dispensaries. Finally, the bill changes state marijuana laws. Federal law prohibits marijuana manufacturing, delivery, and possession and applies to intrastate and interstate violations.

This bill would affect the Department of Workforce Development's Equal Rights, Unemployment Insurance, and Worker's Compensation divisions. The bill modifies Wisconsin's Fair Housing Laws to include affected individuals as a protected class from discrimination. Incidents of alleged discrimination against these individuals are investigated and ruled on by the Equal Rights division. The addition of this new class would minimally increase caseload, but this is absorbable at current staffing levels. For Equal Rights, there would also be a one-time expense of \$5,000 to update and reprint existing publications relating to Wisconsin's Fair Housing Laws. In addition, the Unemployment Insurance division would also need to update related publications, but the division can absorb the cost of the process change within their normal operating budget. Finally, the effect of the bill on Worker's Compensation laws would be subject to court decisions. Consequently, the fiscal effect on the Worker's Compensation division's program administration within DWD is presently indeterminate.
