Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill ratifies and enters Wisconsin into the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact (enhanced compact). The enhanced compact replaces the original Nurse Licensure Compact (original compact), which was ratified in Wisconsin in 1999. Under both versions of the compact, a nurse, whether a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse, who is licensed in a state that has adopted the compact (party state) may practice in any other party state without needing to separately obtain a license in that other party state.

This bill does not change the definition of "school nurse" and it is not expected to place any additional costs on the Department or schools/districts. School nurses are generally responsible for the cost of their licensing rather than the school district that employs them. Having a multistate nursing license would likely provide some cost savings to those school nurses since it would eliminate the need for obtaining separate licensure in each state, which can be a cumbersome and expensive process.
