Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current statute, an emergency phone system public safety answering point is not required to provide, or be certified to provide, assistance beyond transmitting requests for law enforcement, firefighting and emergency medical and ambulance services to the public safety agencies providing such services. Under this bill, public safety answering points must provide telephonic assistance on administering cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), either through a certified dispatcher or dedicated service.

Under this bill, the Department of Military Affairs is required to determine an appropriate continuing education for CPR certified dispatchers. As the Department of Health Services has no role in coordinating, evaluating, or documenting this education, no fiscal effect is expected for the Department of Health Services or on county human services agencies or local health departments.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
