He always remembered his roots and always fought for the little guy and was the voice for the people who felt they didn't have a voice.

Senator Miller, with unanimous consent, asked that the Senate adjourn in honor of the University of Wisconsin football team, who faced arguably the most difficult schedule in college football, were an unranked team who managed to rise as high as into the top 10 in national ranking, played in the Big 10 Championship game and won the Cotton Bowl.
