2017 Wisconsin Act 18 [2017 Senate Bill 126]

Changes to Pharmacy Practice Law and Pharmacy Administrative Rules

2017 Wisconsin Act 18 (the Act) makes various changes to pharmacy practice law and certain rules promulgated by the Pharmacy Examining Board (the board).

Specifically, the Act does the following:

- Repeals the requirement that a license issued by the board be displayed in the place of practice.
- Removes the requirement that a prescription order entered on a medical record of an inpatient or resident of a health care facility include the address of the practitioner.
- Modifies the definition of "long-term care facility" promulgated by the board.
- Repeals certain administrative rules relating to minimum equipment for pharmacies and repeals a requirement that the board prescribe, by rule, minimum standards of professional and technical equipment.
