

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

2017 Wisconsin Act 246 [2017 Senate Bill 230]

Burial or Cremation of a Deceased Inmate or an Unclaimed Corpse

With certain exceptions, 2017 Wisconsin Act 246 allows the superintendent of an institution or other public officer to cremate and bury an unclaimed corpse. The Act also does the following:

- Prohibits cremation of an unclaimed corpse if the deceased person died as a result of homicide.
- Requires the Department of Corrections (DOC) to provide written notification to a
 deceased inmate's relative informing him or her that DOC will allow the relative to
 claim the cremated remains before the remains are buried.
- Requires DOC to assess, collect, and disburse the amount an inmate owes in restitution at the time of his or her death from the inmate's wages or other moneys.
- Expressly allows DOC to charge a prisoner's estate for some or all of the costs to the department of the inmate's incarceration, burial, or cremation and burial.
