2017 SENATE BILL 792

2017 Senate Bill 792 provides that slag generated by the production or processing of iron or steel does not constitute “solid waste” for purposes of certain state statutes relating to solid waste facilities, storage, and treatment, if the slag is managed as an item of value in a controlled manner and is not discarded.

SENATE AMENDMENT 1

Senate Amendment 1 prohibits a person from using unencapsulated slag within 100 feet of a residential dwelling or a building intended to be used in whole or part as a school or daycare facility, unless the person obtains approval from the Department of Natural Resources for that use of unencapsulated slag.

BILL HISTORY

Senator Stroebel introduced Senate Amendment 1 on February 19, 2018. On February 28, 2018, the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Energy voted to recommend adoption of the amendment, on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0, and passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 3; Noes, 2.
