Hi Amanda,

Sorry for the delay in this – the weather and school closings have interfered this week. As I look into this issue, I may need some clarification.

With respect to the request to add bows to the exceptions under 167.31 (2) (a) 2. and (b) 2., the draft (LRB-2725/P2) removes from those provisions the requirement that a crossbow be enclosed in a carrying case in order to be transported in a motorboat or vehicle, but still requires the crossbow to be unloaded, or not cocked if it is loaded. Current law under 167.31 (2) (a) 2. and (b) 2. already allows a bow to be transported in a motorboat or vehicle as long as it "does not have an arrow nocked." There is no current law requirement that a bow also be in a carrying case.

So, if what your constituent wants is for bows to be able to be transported without being in a case, that is already allowed. Is there something else that your constituent is trying to get at? I am including the relevant statutory language below:

167.31 (2) (a) Except as provided in sub. (4), no person may place, possess, or transport a firearm, bow, or crossbow in or on a motorboat with the motor running, unless one of the following applies:

- 1. The firearm is unloaded or is a handgun.
- 2. The bow does not have an arrow nocked.
- 3. The crossbow is not cocked or is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case.
- (b) Except as provided in sub. (4), no person may place, possess, or transport a firearm, bow, or crossbow in or on a vehicle, unless one of the following applies:
- 1. The firearm is unloaded or is a handgun.
- 2. The bow does not have an arrow nocked.
- 3. The crossbow is not cocked or is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case.




