Thank you for your interest in the subject of relocation benefits and authorizing Assembly Bill 256, to address what you describe as "drafting oversights" in Act 243. The fundamental flaw in Act 243 was (and remains) failing to recognize that every entity granted the power to condemn property under Section 32.02 can become a displacing agency and that, from the perspective of the displaced person, business or farmer, it makes no difference which entity is the displacing agency.
