It basically says that nurse-midwives are not also required to also be licensed as regular midwives too. So here that reference is actually correct. Thank you, I agree.

Hi Mike – this is Burt's response: I would not add the change. It is implied and the APRN is the legally responsible party if anything goes wrong, not the person to whom delegated. (The idea that the delegatee will be held to a lesser standard would not likely hold up in a court case.)
