I'm wondering if we can update the draft for LRB to include Marquette University Police as well, based on the language in Ch 165.85:

165.85 (2)(c) "Law enforcement officer" means any person employed by the state or any political subdivision of the state, for the purpose of detecting and preventing crime and enforcing laws or ordinances and who is authorized to make arrests for violations of the laws or ordinances that the person is employed to enforce. 
