Hi Konrad,

Thanks for the quick turnaround on 19a0505\_P1 to amend Senate Bill 300! DHS had a few more recommendations which I've included below. We are hoping to make all three changes as recommended by DHS, and if possible, introduce the amendment on Monday. I know this is a quick turn-around, but we appreciate all of your help on this amendment.

Page 1, Line 2: Would recommend changing to, "who have a specific focus on the diagnosis and treatment of infectious diseases,". Having a specific focus on Lyme disease or vector-borne disease would limit the choice of providers to only a small group in the state and would exclude most board certified infectious disease physicians or even some family practice or internal medicine physicians.

With regards to the additional committee member (Page 1, Line 7) we'd recommend saying "including, but not limited to, a person who is board certified by the American Board of...". Including this will broaden the pool of eligible people as the board certification alone would limit the number of qualified people to a very small number of people in the state.

Page 2, Line 1: Since the false negative is more prone to the early stages but the false positive could happen at any time, making this distinction would be helpful. "patients about the increased potential of receiving a false negative test in the early stages of a tick-borne disease and the potential of receiving a false positive test, along with....."

Hi Konrad,

I hope you're doing well!

We're looking to draft an amendment to the Tick-Borne Disease Study Committee bill (SB 300) to address some of the recommendations posed by the Department of Health Services during the hearing.

First, we're looking to expand the membership of the committee by two members. The first additional member would be 'a Technical Director of a clinical microbiology laboratory or the equivalent, including but not limited to, someone who is Board Certified by the American Board of Medical Microbiology to direct medical and public health microbiology laboratories.' That language is directly from DHS. The second member would be a pharmacist.

Second, on page 3, lines 9 and 10, we'd like to make some changes/additions to the provision on the notifications on testing. We'd like to see something similar to these changes: "Recommendations for policies about notifying people patients about the increased potential of receiving a false negative test and the potential for a false positive test in the early stages of a tick-borne disease, along with recommendations to educate providers on how to interpret these tests, when testing is appropriate, and how to communicate test results to patients."

Third, on page 2, lines 3 to 5, we'd like to provide some slight changes to the language on health care provides for the committee to read something like: "Three health care providers, as defined in s. 146.81 (1), with a specific focus in the diagnosis and treatment of Lyme disease or another vector-borne diseases, appointed by the governor. At least one of the members appointed under this subdivision shall reside north of USH 10."

Finally, on page 2, lines 12 to 14, we'd also like to expand the advocates for Lyme disease policy or residents of this state affected by Lyme disease to three members instead of two, maintaining that one must be from north of Highway 10.

We are hoping for a quick turn-around on this amendment if possible as we may be looking to get this bill out of the senate committee next week.

  - 2. Page 2, line 12: delete "Two" and substitute "Three".
  - **3.** Page 2, line 21: after that line insert:
    - "12. One technical director, or the equivalent, of a clinical microbiology laboratory, including, but not limited to, a person who is board certified by the American Board of Medical Microbiology to direct a medical and public health microbiology laboratory, appointed by the governor.
      - 13. One pharmacist, appointed by the governor.".
    - 4. Page 3, line 9: delete the material beginning with "people" and ending with "disease" on line 10 and substitute "patients about the increased potential of receiving a false negative test in the early stages of a tick-borne disease and the

potential for a false positive test, along with recommendations to educate providers on how to interpret these tests, when testing is appropriate, and how to communicate test results to patients".
