Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, there is no public notice requirement when an incumbent local elected official whose office is up for election either files a notification of noncandidacy or fails to file a notification of candidacy within a specified time frame.

Under this bill, if such an incumbent files a notification of noncandidacy or fails to file a netification of candidacy, that fact must be posted on the Internet and three different locations within the relevant jurisdiction. The bill's public notice requirement applies to the clerk or other officer or body with whom current law requires a notice of candidacy to be filed for a particular office.

We just have one additional question. The initial applicability sections says "This act first applies to the April 6, 2021, election". That means that this bill would apply to noncandidacy deadlines in December 2020, since those deadlines are in place for the April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2021 election, correct?
