Hi Cathlene,

We would want to start with including these provisions:

- Prohibit untraceable guns by requiring that 3D-printed firearms and unfinished frames and receivers carry a serial number.
  - I'm not sure if the serial numbers would need to be reported to DOJ or how current firearm serial numbers are handled? But we would want to make sure the information gets to the correct agency.
- Prohibit the indiscriminate distribution of code to produce 3D-printed guns—for example, only allow distribution to a specific individual after a background check has been conducted, or only allow distribution to licensed firearm manufacturers.
- Prohibit undetectable firearms by requiring that all operable firearms be detectable by standard screening systems.
- Require a license to manufacture or assemble a firearm using unfinished materials or a 3D printer.

# Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits the manufacture, transportation, sale, possession, and carrying of firearms that cannot be detected by metal detectors or airport x-ray machines or scanners. A person who violates the prohibition is guilty of a Class G felony.

This bill also prohibits the sale, posting, provision, or possession of plans for manufacturing an undetectable firearm. A person who violates the prohibition is guilty of a Class H\_felony.

Finally, the bill prohibits the possession of a frame or a receiver of a firearm that is not marked with a serial number. A person who violates the prohibition is guilty of a Class H felony.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report.
