Hi Eric,

Sorry for the delay in getting back to you. I was out sick yesterday and I am out today with a sick kid but working from home.

If I understand correctly, you are interested in allowing someone to go over 3 hours a day but not all the time. There are a couple ways we could do this:

- 1. Change it from "for no more than 3 hours a day" to "for no more than 15 hours a week." This would allow flexibility within a broader weekly limit, but it would allow, for example, a child to be there for one 8 hour day and one 7 hour day.
- 2. Be very specific: "for no more than 3 hours a day, except that one day per week the child may receive care and supervision for no more than 4 hours as long as the total number of hours of care and supervision received in a week does not exceed 15."

Does one of those sound better to you, or some variation?
