The intent of this bill is to provide funding to the Department of Justice to collaborate with local law enforcement agencies to facilitate and ensure that every law enforcement agency in Wisconsin use Incident Based Reporting for their crime data collecting and reporting. The DOJ shall make dollars available in the form of grants to local law enforcement agencies to facilitate the transition.

The funding would be \$1,000,000 in General Purpose Revenue for the 2021-2022 biennium only.

Currently in Wisconsin, roughly 70% of local law enforcement agencies collect crime data using an Incident Based Reporting (IBR) system. This system captures a wider amount of information regarding the alleged crime, including a more detailed and accurate recording of the type of crime. The remaining 30% of local law enforcement agencies use a Summary Based Reporting (SBR) system, which collects and reports substantially less information regarding the alleged crime.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation has set IBR as the federal standard for crime reporting, phasing out SBR in the near future.

**PRELIMINARY DRAFT - NOT READY FOR INTRODUCTION**

1 AN ACT ...; relating to: grants to local law enforcement agencies for  
2 incident-based reporting and making an appropriation.

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***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

This bill provides \$600,000 in funding for the 2021-22 fiscal year for the Department of Justice to provide grants to local law enforcement agencies in order to facilitate the transition to the use of incident-based reporting for crime data.

For further information see the ***state and local*** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

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***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

3 **SECTION 1. Fiscal changes.**

4 (1) GRANTS TO LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES FOR INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING.

5 In the schedule under s. 20.005 (3) for the appropriation to the department of justice  
6 under s. 20.455 (2) (a), the dollar amount for fiscal year 2021-22 is increased by  
7 \$600,000 to provide grants to local law enforcement agencies to facilitate the  
8 transition to the use of incident-based reporting for crime data.

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**SECTION 2. Effective date.**

(1) This act takes effect on July 1, 2021 or the day after the publication of the 2021-2023 biennial budget act, whichever occurs later.
