Per your request, please see attached two documents. First, an National Council of State Legislatures document reviewing the legislative youth advisory councils that existed in 2009, including their funding, staff, membership, and duties. There have been some changes since then:

1. Most of the responsibilities of the Maine program, including its authority to introduce legislation, were removed in 2009 Maine Public Law, Ch. 623. The entire council was eliminated in 2015 Main Public Laws, Ch. 491, following three years of inactivity.
2. The Maryland program’s membership was greatly reduced in 2016 Laws of Maryland Ch. 620.
3. Minn. Stats. § 124D.957, created in 2013, established a statutory role for the Minnesota Youth Council Committee (MYCC) within the Minnesota Alliance With Youth, a nonprofit organization.<sup>[1]</sup> The MYCC provides advice to the governor and legislature, including providing feedback on youth-related legislation. The MYCC has the ability to hold hearings on legislation in the Minnesota House and Senate, propose legislation relating to youth, and prepare a youth omnibus bill.

I also came across an executive analog to these legislative advisory programs. Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick issued Executive Order No. 501 in 2008, creating the Governor’s Statewide Youth Council. The council makes recommendations to the governor on youth issues.

The second document is a memo reviewing state legislatures’ paid internship programs.

***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

This bill authorizes the employment of up to two paid interns in each assembly office and up to six paid interns in the Milwaukee offices of the governor and Department of Justice. Each intern must be from 18 to 25 years old and come from a low-income family. Under the bill, each intern must be paid a stipend of at least \$12.65 per hour, which may be paid for up to 20 hours per week of work for up to 36 weeks each year. Under the bill, the stipend is required to be disregarded in establishing household income for purposes of obtaining public benefits under any state program.

The bill also requires the Department of Administration to establish a program for the placement of paid interns with Wisconsin businesses. The program requirements parallel the requirements set forth above. In addition, the bill requires DOA to seek to coordinate with the Metropolitan Milwaukee Association of Commerce to administer the intern placement program and to provide matching funds for purposes of paying intern stipends. The bill appropriates \$2,500,000 to DOA for the program.

Good evening,

First, thank you for all the work you are doing on drafting LRB 4991. Since our last discussion I've decided on several other changes.

1. Instead of 36 weeks, I would like to create terms. A 16 weeks term in the beginning of the year which aligns with the spring UW semester. Starting the second week of January.
  - a. A 10 week summer term starting the first week of the month of June. ✓
  - b. Another 16 week semester beginning the first week of the month of September beginning after labor day. ✓
  - c. **\*For the legislative interns\*** The Spring, Summer, and fall semester would apply during any odd year. ✓  
During the even year there would just be a spring semester.
  - d. **\*For the Gov./DOJ Milwaukee office as well as the DOA program \*** There would be internship opportunities for the spring, summer and fall terms during both the odd and even year. ✓
2. Taking out the "Milwaukee Association of Commerce" and replacing it with "Seeking private partnership". I have not had a chance to meet with the MMAC and do not have the desire to commit them to anything in legislation. ✓
3. Provided a low-income qualification table. ? Include a standard. ✓
4. Changing the allocation of the DOA program from \$2,500,000 to \$500,000. ✓
5. I want to give the bill/program a name. Something like the Equal Opportunity Internship. ✓
