Marie:

Please take a look at current s. 106.273, stats. This section was changed significantly by 2017 Acts 59 and 336 after your bill (2017-18 LRB-1557/1, companion to LRB-2386/1) was drafted. As a result of those changes, it appears that the main purpose of your bill, namely eliminating the per pupil limitation, is current law. See s. 106.273 (3) (a) 1m., stats. Let me know if you disagree.

If you agree and want a bill that simply changes the appropriation that applies to CTE incentive grants, it may be best to try to make that change as part of the budget.

If you don't want to include this change in the budget, and instead want to proceed with a stand-alone bill (that won't be effective until after the budget), please answer the following questions:

- 1) Do you want to:
  - a. Create a new, separate appropriation with new money in the amount of \$7 million annually OR
  - b. Allocate \$7 million annually from the existing Fast Forward appropriation under s. 20.445 (1) (b) with no new money OR
  - c. Allocate \$7 million annually from the existing Fast Forward appropriation under s. 20.445 (1) (b) <u>and</u> increase the amount of the current appropriation by \$7 million for each fiscal year?
- 2) Do you want the \$7 million amount to fund 1) only the programs described under s. 106.273 (2) (a), relating to mitigating workforce shortages; or 2) also those described under s. 106.273 (2) (b), relating to training emergency responders?


