













Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 SECTION 1. 5.15 (4) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:
4 5.15 (4) (a) Except as provided in par. (c), the division ordinance or resolution
5 shall number all wards in the municipality with unique whole numbers in
6 consecutive order, beginning with the number one, shall designate the polling place
7 for each ward, and shall describe the boundaries of each ward consistent with the
8 conventions set forth in s. 4.003. No ward line may cross the boundary of a
9 congressional, an assembly, or a supervisory district. The ordinance or resolution

1 shall be accompanied by a list of the block numbers used by the U.S. bureau of the
2 census that are wholly or partly contained within each ward, with any block numbers
3 partly contained within a ward identified, and a map of the municipality which
4 illustrates the revised ward boundaries. If the legislature, in an act redistricting
5 legislative districts under article IV, section 3, of the constitution, or in redistricting
6 congressional districts, establishes a district boundary within a municipality that
7 does not coincide with the boundary of a ward established under the ordinance or
8 resolution of the municipality, the municipal governing body shall, no later than
9 April 10 of the 2nd year following the year of the federal decennial census on which
10 the act is based, amend the ordinance or resolution to the extent required to effect
11 the act. The amended ordinance or resolution shall designate the polling place for
12 any ward that is created to effect the legislative act. Nothing in this paragraph shall
13 be construed to compel a county or city to alter or redraw supervisory or aldermanic
14 districts.
