Hello Cathlene,

Thank you for getting the resolution back to us so quickly. I was reading over it and I noticed just a few errors. Most of them were from my original document. It often happens to me that I look at a thing for too long and become blind to the mistakes I've made.

In the Whereas that begins "Gustafson will graduate," the wording should be "All-Academic Big Ten" not "Academic All-Big Ten."

In the Whereas that begins "during her college career," I included "two time Big Ten Player of the Year" which we talked about in length in the paragraph prior, so I would like it if that one gets taken out.

In the Whereas that begins "an incredible college career came to an end," Megan set records for season percentages AND field goal percentages, so I corrected it in the "season field goal percentages." Also in that paragraph, there's a verb tense discontinuity where she was "leading" her team and then it changes to "helped" so I changed it to "helping."

I have highlighted all these changes in the attached document, I just wanted to explain them more fully. Thank you for getting this to us, we really appreciate it!
