## 2019 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1     **Relating to:** proclaiming January 22nd as “Protect Life Day”.

2             Whereas, 46<sup>47</sup> years have elapsed since the infamous January 22, 1973, U.S.  
3     Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion for any reason for the full nine  
4     months of pregnancy in all of the United States; and

5             Whereas, it is the first and primary duty of the government to protect its  
6     citizens, a role which the Court usurped from the states; and

7             Whereas, more than 60 million unborn children have been killed by abortions  
8     nationally, a human rights abuse unprecedented in American history; and

9             Whereas, more than 570,000 of Wisconsin’s unborn children are lost to  
10    Wisconsin families, and their skills and talents are lost to the state of Wisconsin; and

11            Whereas, countless mothers, fathers, families, and society as a whole have  
12    suffered devastating consequences from this wholesale destruction of human life;

14            Whereas, the future of our state and country depends on protection of the  
15    weakest members of the human family; now, therefore, be it
