SAFETY AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES [] PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE - CS
Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides for the licensure of dental therapists, who are health care practitioners who may engage in the limited practice of dentistry.

Under current law, dentists and dental hygienists are licensed by the Dentistry Examining Board to practice dentistry and dental hygiene, respectively. This bill provides for the licensure of a third type of dental practitioner, dental therapists. Under the bill, the board must grant a dental therapist license to an individual who satisfies certain criteria, including completion of a dental therapy program and passage of required examinations.

Dental therapists may provide dental therapy services only under the general supervision of a dentist with whom the dental therapist has a collaborative management agreement that addresses various aspects of the dental therapist's practice. Supervision by a dentist requires the dentist's prior knowledge and consent, but does not require the presence of the dentist at the time a task or procedure is being performed or prior examination or diagnosis of a patient by a dentist prior to the provision of dental therapy services by a dental therapist. Dental therapists are, subject to the terms of a collaborative management agreement, limited to providing services, treatments, and procedures that are specified in the bill, as well as additional services, treatments, or procedures specified by the board by rule. Dental therapists must complete 12 hours of continuing education each biennium.

The bill subjects dental therapists to, or covers dental therapists under, various other laws, including the health care records law, the volunteer health care provider program, the health care worker protection law, and the emergency volunteer health care practitioner law. The bill also provides for loan forgiveness for dental therapists under the health care provider loan assistance program.

Finally, the bill requires, effective when the first individual becomes licensed as a dental therapist in this state, that two dental therapists be added to the board.

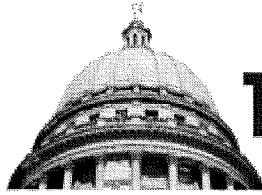

GOVERNOR ANNOUNCES MARIJUANA CHANGES

Governor Evers has announced his intention to make changes to marijuana laws in Wisconsin. At a press conference in the capitol, Evers announced that his budget will include a proposal to legalize medical marijuana, decriminalize possession of small amounts of marijuana for personal use, establish an expungement procedure for individuals who have completed their sentence or probation for possession, and make changes to the CBD oil laws to align them with federal standards.

The proposal would allow for a physician, or a practitioner under the direction of a physician to prescribe medical marijuana for medical conditions including cancer, glaucoma, PTSD, chronic pain, severe nausea, HIV, Crohns, Hepatitis C, Alzheimer's, seizures and others.

According to the Governor's office, DHS and DATCP will regulate a medical marijuana program. Individuals would be required to apply with DHS and pay a fee for a license to use medical marijuana. Individuals that have committed violent felonies in the last ten years will be ineligible to use medical marijuana. Places dispensing medical marijuana will apply for a license and pay a fee to DATCP. DATCP will be in charge of regulating the growing, selling, processing and testing of medical marijuana. Medical marijuana dispensed in Wisconsin must be grown in Wisconsin. The proposal would spend \$1,577,600 in the biennium for 5.5 FTR positions. The Governor's office expects to take in \$2,268,700 in sales tax revenue

Evers wants to decriminalize possession, manufacturing, or distribution of marijuana for amounts less than 25 grams. The Governor's decriminalization would ban local communities from creating ordinances or penalties for less than 25 grams. The plan would allow individuals convicted of

marijuana charges of less than 25 grams to apply for expungement after they have completed their sentence or probation.

Governor Evers will present his state budget at 7 pm, Thursday, February 28 in the Assembly chambers.

CRAIG AND FELZKOWSKI PROPOSE DENTAL THERAPY

Sen. Dave Craig and Rep. Mary Felzkowski are circulating a bill for cosponsorship that would create and license dental therapists in Wisconsin. Wisconsin currently licenses dentists and dental hygienists by the Dentistry Examining Board; the bill being circulated would add a third category of license – dental therapist. A dental therapist would only be allowed to provide dental therapy services under the supervision of a licensed dentist. While a dental therapist would be licensed and under the general supervision of a dentist, supervision does not require the dentist be present at the time a dental therapist is providing services. Dental therapists would be subject to the collaborative management agreement determined by the supervising dentists, and the services, treatments, or procedures specified by the accrediting board rule. Dental therapists would be subject to health care records laws, the volunteer health care provided program, the health care worker protection law, and the emergency volunteer health care practitioner law. There is a loan forgiveness provision in the bill.

Dental therapists are currently licensed in Arizona, Maine, Michigan, Minnesota and Vermont with tribal authorization in Alaska, Washington, and Oregon. Minnesota's dental therapy legislation was passed in 2009, and the first dental therapist was licensed and employed in 2011. According to information from the Minnesota Department of Health, by 2014 Minnesota had 32 licensed dental therapists, there are now 79 dental therapists practicing in Minnesota. In 2016, more than 94,000 dental visits were with dental therapists.

According to a map from the Wisconsin Office of Rural Health, a significant portion of Wisconsin has "population-based" dental access shortage, while specific areas have a shortage of facilities. The author's cosponsorship memo states "A staggering 64 of the 72 counties in Wisconsin face dentist shortages. Even more concerning, there are currently over 1 million Wisconsinites who depend on Medicaid for dental benefits that face additional barriers – only 37% of current dentists in the state accept Medicaid patients."

According to the authors, a dental therapy program takes three years to complete, and Northcentral Technical College believes they would be prepared to start taking students shortly after the bill would become law. However, the bill would allow Wisconsin to license dental therapists that come to Wisconsin from accredited programs in other states, meaning there is the potential for dental therapists to begin working under the supervision of licensed Wisconsin dentists immediately upon enactment of the bill. The cost to develop the program and Northcentral

Technical College is \$1 million, but the authors expect much of that cost to be covered through donations.

The legislation would allow dental therapists to dispense medications prescribed by the licensed dentists they are supervised by, but they would not be allowed to write prescriptions.
