MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

This bill expands the definition of telehealth for the purposes of reimbursement of mental health services provided through telehealth under the Medical Assistance program. Currently, the definition of telehealth only includes, real-time communications between individuals and health care providers. The bill includes in the definition real-time communications between providers and asynchronous transmissions of digital images or data between providers, known as store-and-forward technology. The definition of telehealth currently and under the bill does not include telephone conversations or Internet-based communications between providers or between providers and individuals.
