- 16.996 Educational technology training grants.
 - (1) PURPOSE. The department shall annually award grants to eligible consortia of school districts, to consortia of eligible public libraries, and to eligible public library systems for the costs of training teachers and librarians to use educational technology.
 - (2) ELIGIBLE CONSORTIA. A consortium of school districts is eligible for a grant under this section if all of the following apply:
 - (a) The consortium consists of 3 or more school districts.
 - (b) Each school district's membership based on the most recent available and finalized school year data in the previous school year divided by that school district's area in square miles is 13 or less.
 - (c) The consortium applies for a grant under this section.
 - (2m) ELIGIBLE PUBLIC LIBRARIES AND PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEMS.
 - (a) In this subsection:
 - 1. "Library branch" means a fixed location where public library services, including a collection of library materials, are offered by paid library employees as part of a consolidated county public library, as described in s. 43.57 (1).
 - 2. "Rural territory" means any territory, population, and housing units located outside of urban areas and urban clusters.
 - 3. "Service area" means the population of the municipality in which the library is located. If a library operates as a joint library under s. 43.53, Stats, the service area is the total of the populations of all municipalities participating in the joint library.
 - 4. "Urban cluster" means an urban area, as defined by the U.S. bureau of the census, with a population of at least 2,500 but less than 50,000.
 - 5. "Urbanized area" means an urban area, as defined by the U.S. bureau of the census, with a population of 50,000 or more.
 - (b) A public library or branch of a public library [library branch] is an eligible library under this section if the population of the municipality within which the library or branch of the library is located is 20,000 or less and is located in a rural territory. and if the public library or branch [library branch] is located in one of the following areas of the state:
 - 1. A rural territory, as defined by the U.S. bureau of the census, that is one of the following:
 - a. Less than or equal to 5 miles from an urbanized area.
 - b. Less than or equal to 2.5 miles from an urban cluster.
 - 2. A rural territory, as defined by the U.S. bureau of the census, that is one of the following:
 - a. More than 5 miles but less than or equal to 25 miles from an urbanized area.
 - b. More than 2.5 miles but less than or equal to 10 miles from an urban cluster.
 - 3. A rural territory, as defined by the U.S. bureau of the census, that is more than 25 miles from an urbanized area and also more than 10 miles from an urban cluster.
 - (c) A consortium of public libraries is eligible for a grant under this section and a public library system is eligible for a grant under this section if all of the following apply:

- 1. Either of the following applies:
 - a. The consortium consists of 3 or more eligible public libraries or library branches.
 - b. The public library system contains 3 or more eligible public libraries or library branches.
- 2. The consortium or public library system applies for a grant under this section.
- (3) GRANTS TO ELIGIBLE CONSORTIA OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS; AMOUNT. In any year the department awards a grant to an eligible consortia of school districts under this section, subject to sub. (4), the department shall pay to the eligible consortium the sum of the following amounts:
 - (a) For each school district in the consortium that had a membership of less than 750 pupils according to the most recent available and finalized school year data in the previous year, \$7,500.
 - (b) For each school district in the consortium that had a membership of 750 pupils to 1,500 pupils according to the most recent available and finalized school year data in the previous year, \$10 multiplied by the school district's membership in the previous year.
 - (c) For each school district in the consortium that had a membership of more than 1,500 pupils according to the most recent available and finalized school year data in the previous year, \$15,000.

16.9945 (2m) (b) A public library, including the branch of a public library [a library branch], is eligible for a grant under this section in fiscal year 2017–18 or in fiscal year 2018–19 or in both fiscal years if the population of the municipality within which the library or branch of the library [library branch] is located, as determined during the first year of the biennium, is 20,000 or less...

- 16.9945 (3) MAXIMUM AWARDS TO ELIGIBLE SCHOOL DISTRICTS. The total amount the department may award to an eligible school district under sub. (1) during a fiscal biennium may not exceed the following:
- (a) If the membership of the eligible school district, as determined in the first year of the biennium, is fewer than 750 pupils, \$30,000.
- (b) If the membership of the eligible school district, as determined in the first year of the biennium, is 750 pupils to 1,500 pupils, \$40 multiplied by the school district's membership.
- (c) If the membership of the eligible school district, as determined in the first year of the biennium, is more than 1,500 pupils, \$60,000.

The following change is to modify the curriculum grant language to remove the reference to video-based curriculum development and implementation, increase the funding total from \$25,000 to up to \$100,000, and decrease the number of schools necessary to for a consortium from 8 to 5.

16.997 (1) and (2) Removal of various references to "video data links".

16.997 (2) (d) Require an education agency to pay the department not more than \$250 per month for each data line or video link that is provided to the educational agency under the program established under (1), except that the charge may not exceed \$100 per month for each data line or video link that relies on a transport medium that operates at a speed of less than 1 gigabyte 1.544 megabits per second.

16.997 (7) From the appropriation under s. 20.505 (4) (s), the department shall award up to \$100,000 \$25,000 annually in grants to consortia of school districts that meet all of the following criteria for the purpose of developing and implementing a technology-enhanced high school curriculum:

- (a) The curriculum is developed for and implemented through streaming video conferencing and technology-based methods such as online course work.
- (b) The consortium includes high schools from at least 8-5 school districts.
- (c) The participating school districts collectively contribute an amount equal to at least the amount of the grant received in the same fiscal year.
- (d) The curriculum is made available to each high school participating in the consortium any high school statewide.

Also, a question re: the data being based on the first year of the biennium – we've asked that 16.9945 (2m) (b) be updated to state that a library is eligible if the population of the municipality in which the library is located, as determined during the first year of the biennium, is 20,000 or less. Is this update also needed for 16.9945 (3m) ((a)-(c))? E.g., (3m) (a) "If the population of the municipality within which the eligible public library or branch is located, as determined during the first year of the biennium, is ...".

I agree that the update is needed for 16.9945 (3m) (a) to (c). The intro. to those paragraphs (i.e., 16.9945 (3m) (intro.)) refers the maximum amount that can be awarded during a fiscal biennium. Therefore, you can clarify in pars. (a) to (c) that population is determined based on the first year of that biennium. I will go ahead and add those changes to the draft.

Hi Derek:

I have 2 questions about this request.

First, you defining a term, "service area," but, unless I'm missing it, it doesn't look like you are using the term in your new language. Also, the term is not used in current law in subch. IX of ch. 16. Should I delete the definition or do you want to clarify where the term should be used?

Originally, DPI told us that they could not compile library information according to the population of the municipality as the statutory language states, but rather by "service area" and this statutory language request originally reflected defining "service area" and the use of "service area" to determine library eligibility.

When DPI provided information used for FY19 grant eligibility for libraries, it was according to the population of the municipality, so the request was updated to remove items related to updating the language to define and incorporate "service area". However, I neglected to remove the language that the LRB is now asking about. It should be removed.

Second, you are clarifying how to determine school district membership in ss. 16.9945 (3) (a), (b), and (c) (based on first year of biennium) and 16.996 (2) (b) and (3) (a), (b), and (c) (based on most recent available and finalized data). However, school district membership is also mentioned in s. 16.9945 (2)((a) and (b), where it is based on the previous school year. Is it okay to leave s. 16.9945 (2) (a) and (b) as is?

16.9945 (2) (a) and (b) should also be updated to reflect that school district membership should be based on the most recent available and finalized data.

Also, a question re: the data being based on the first year of the biennium – we've asked that 16.9945 (2m) (b) be updated to state that a library is eligible if the population of the municipality in which the library is located, as determined during the first year of the biennium, is 20,000 or less. Is this update also needed for 16.9945 (3m) ((a)-(c))? E.g., (3m) (a) "If the population of the municipality within which the eligible public library or branch is located, as determined during the first year of the biennium, is ...".

Urban and Rural Definition

How does the Census Bureau define "urban" and "rural?'

The Census Bureau's urban-rural classification is fundamentally a delineation of geographical areas, identifying both individual urban areas and the rural areas of the nation. The Census Bureau's urban areas represent densely developed territory, and encompass residential, commercial, and other non-residential urban land uses. For the 2010 Census, an urban area will comprise a densely settled core of census tracts and/or census blocks that meet minimum population density requirements, along with adjacent territory containing non-residential urban land uses as well as territory with low population density included to link outlying densely settled territory with the densely settled core. To qualify as an urban area, the territory identified according to criteria must encompass at least 2,500 people, at least 1,500 of which reside outside institutional group quarters,

The Census Bureau identifies two types of urban areas:

- · Urbanized Areas (UAs) of 50,000 or more people;
- Urban Clusters (UCs) of at least 2,500 and less than 50,000 people.

"Rural" encompasses all population, housing, and territory not included within an urban area.

The specific criteria used to define urban areas for the 2010 Census were published in the Federal Register (/geo/treference/firn.html) of August 24, 2011.

Hi Derek:

I have 2 questions about this request.

First, you defining a term, "service area," but, unless I'm missing it, it doesn't look like you are using the term in your new language. Also, the term is not used in current law in subch. IX of ch. 16. Should I delete the definition or do you want to clarify where the term should be used?

Originally, DPI told us that they could not compile library information according to the population of the municipality as the statutory language states, but rather by "service area" and this statutory language request originally reflected defining "service area" and the use of "service area" to determine library eligibility.

When DPI provided information used for FY19 grant eligibility for libraries, it was according to the population of the municipality, so the request was updated to remove items related to updating the language to define and incorporate "service area". However, I neglected to remove the language that the LRB is now asking about. It should be removed.

Second, you are clarifying how to determine school district membership in ss. 16.9945 (3) (a), (b), and (c) (based on first year of biennium) and 16.996 (2) (b) and (3) (a), (b), and (c) (based on most recent available and finalized data). However, school district membership is also mentioned in s. 16.9945 (2)((a) and (b), where it is based on the previous school year. Is it okay to leave s. 16.9945 (2) (a) and (b) as is?

16.9945 (2) (a) and (b) should also be updated to reflect that school district membership should be based on the most recent available and finalized data.

Also, a question re: the data being based on the first year of the biennium – we've asked that 16.9945 (2m) (b) be updated to state that a library is eligible if the population of the municipality in which the library is located, as determined during the first year of the biennium, is 20,000 or less. 
