1. Technology for Educational Achievement program

This bill makes various changes to the Technology for Educational Achievement program, known as TEACH, which is administered by DOA. The bill eliminates grants to the following under the program: 1) school districts, public libraries, and public library systems for training teacher and librarians to use educational technology; and 2) school districts for developing and implementing a technology-enhanced high school curriculum. For information technology block grants under the program, the bill specifies that a school district's eligibility is based on its membership in the most recent school year for which finalized data is available, instead of membership in the previous year. Also for those grants, for other requirements that refer to municipal population, the bill clarifies that population is determined in the first year of a fiscal biennium. For the educational telecommunications access program under TEACH, the bill increases the data line speed that applies to a limit on what DOA may charge educational agencies for data lines. The bill also eliminates references to video links under TEACH.
