PRIMARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

This bill changes the purposes for which DPI awards grants to support gifted and talented pupils. Under current law, DPI must award these grants for the purpose of providing services and activities to gifted and talented pupils that will allow the pupils to fully develop their capabilities. Under the bill, DPI must award the grants for the purposes of providing such services and activities to underrepresented gifted and talented pupils, specifically gifted and talented pupils who are minority pupils, economically disadvantaged pupils, children with disabilities, or limited-English proficient pupils; and for providing teachers with professional development and training related to identifying and educating all gifted and talented pupils.
