

Currently, DWD must award CTE incentive grants to school districts that have programs approved by DWD and the amount of each grant depends on the number of pupils who complete the school district's programs. DWD also must award CTE completion awards to pupils for each DWD-approved program the pupil completes that is related to public safety occupations. The bill also transfers program approval authority from DWD to DPI.
