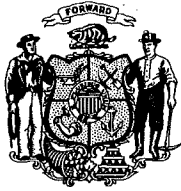

Please draft language that changes grant amounts for seal-a-smile program: \$700,000 annually preventive services and \$100,000 annually for restorative services. The amount should total \$800,000 total of the school-based dental sealant program. Additionally, include non-stat language that funds SFY 2020 with a lower funding: \$525,000 for preventive and \$100,000 for restorative services. The amount should total \$625,000 for SFY 2020. Finally, under s. 250.10(1m)(b) please eliminate the \$25,000 funding for flouride supplements and fluoride mouth-rinse. The new language should provide \$50,000 for "fluoride varnish and other evidence-based oral health activities."
