## EMPLOYMENT (6)

Additionally, probably in nonstate, we would like to require a task force to study options for achieving a \$15/hour minimum wage in Wisconsin, or other options to increase compensation. 

# Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau EMPLOYMENT

#### 1. Minimum wage

This bill raises the minimum wages to be paid to most employees annually, from the effective date of the bill through January 1, 2024. After that date, the bill requires DWD to determine the percentage difference between the consumer price index for the preceding 12-month period and the consumer price index for the 12 months before the preceding 12-month period, adjust the minimum wages then in effect by that percentage difference, and publish those amounts in the Wisconsin Administrative Register and on the DWD website.

The bill requires the secretary of workforce development to establish a committee to study options to achieve a \$15 per hour minimum wage and other options to increase compensation for workers in this state. Under the bill, the committee consists of nine members, with five appointed by the governor, and one each appointed by the speaker of the assembly, the assembly minority leader, the senate majority leader, and the senate minority leader. The committee is required to submit a report containing its recommendations for options to achieve a \$15 per hour minimum wage and other options to increase compensation for workers in this state to the governor and the appropriate standing committees of the legislature no later than October 1, 2020.
