2 which the employee was paid the highest total wages, rounded down to the nearest
3 whole dollar, except that, if that amount is less than \$54, no benefits are payable to
4 the employee and, if that amount is more than \$370, the employee's weekly benefit
5 rate shall be \$370 before January 5, 2020, and except that, if the employee's benefits
6 are exhausted during any week under s. 108.06 (1), the employee shall be paid the
7 remaining amount of benefits payable to the employee under s. 108.06 (1). The
8 department shall publish on its Internet site a weekly benefit rate schedule of
9 quarterly wages and the corresponding weekly benefit rates as calculated in
10 accordance with this paragraph.
