## # Temporary Assistance for Needy Families

Under current law, DCF allocates specific amounts of federal moneys, including child care development funds and moneys received under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant program in each fiscal year for various public assistance programs, for child care-related purposes, including day care licensing activities, and for paying a portion of the claims under the earned income tax credit. This bill continues, increases, decreases, or modifies those allocations. Under current law, \$175,000 of TANF funding is allocated to the Be GREAT: Graduate program operated by the Boys and Girls Clubs of America in Green Bay, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, and Appleton. The bill allocates \$1,400,000 of TANF funding to the Be GREAT: Graduate program but does not specify which cities that funding must be allocated to.
