The grant funds, allocated under s.49.175 (1)(p), may be used for start-up costs, ongoing operational costs, including subsidy payments for eligible families and quality improvement activities. A child care provider that is awarded a grant under this subsection shall contribute matching funds equal to 25 percent of the amount awarded. The match may be in the form of money or in-kind good or services or both.

The department may also funding under s.49.175 (1)(qm) to award grants to child care providers and child care workers to improve overall child care quality in the same geographic area selected.
