

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau JUSTICE

> Law enforcement overtime grants

This bill changes the appropriation for law enforcement overtime grants from a continuing appropriation to an annual sum certain appropriation. A continuing appropriation is expendable until fully depleted, and the moneys held therein do not lapse. An annual sum certain appropriation is expendable only for the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made and only up to the dollar amount shown in the schedule for that fiscal year. Therefore, the effect of this change is to allow only the amounts shown in the schedule for law enforcement overtime grants to be expended in each fiscal year of the 2019-21 biennium.

This bill also transfers the remaining moneys that had been appropriated to law enforcement overtime grants in the 2017-19 fiscal biennium to an appropriation to be used at the discretion of the attorney general.
