Current law requires DOT to administer a statewide public safety radio management program. This bill requires DOT to provide \$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2020-21 for infrastructure and equipment replacement and system technology maintenance for this program.

The bill requires DOT to issue a request for proposals for a statewide public safety interoperable communications system to be deployed on existing tower sites and repeals from current law a similar requirement of DMA. The bill authorizes DOT to spend up to \$500,000 for professional consulting services related to the request for proposals.

The amounts in these appropriations are unchanged from the 2017 biennium, but will likely be revised in the 2019 biennial budget based on WisDOT and DMA estimates of anticipated fee collections. Since these appropriations fee-based, this draft does not revise the schedules. Section 2 below instead requires DOT to expend \$3 million annually of appropriated funds for improvements to WISCOM.

SECTION 2. AMEND WIS. STAT. § 85.12(1)

Section 85.12 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

(1) The department shall administer a statewide public safety radio management program. From the appropriations under s. 20.395 (5) (dk) and (dq), the department may provide statewide tower site management, public safety frequency management, public safety database administration and planning services related to statewide public safety radio management. From the appropriation account under s. 20.395 (5) (dq), the department shall provide \$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2019-2020 and \$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2020-2021 for infrastructure and equipment replacement and system technology maintenance.

Notes: Section 85.12 requires WisDOT to administer a statewide public safety radio management program including statewide tower site management, public safety frequency management, public safety database administration and planning services related to statewide public safety radio management. WisDOT is required to maintain existing communications equipment at state patrol towers and stations unless the cost exceeds the benefits. This section requires WisDOT to spend \$3,000,000 for improvements to WISCOM. This is in addition to funding allocated by WisDOT for staff salaries and other program support which is estimated to be approximately \$750,000 annually.

SECTION 3. CREATE WIS. STAT. § 85.12(4)

Section 85.12 (4) of the statutes is <u>created</u> to read:

(4) The department shall, no later than June 30, 2020, conduct a request for proposals for a statewide public safety interoperable communications system to be deployed on the existing tower sites. Notwithstanding s. 16.75 (1) and (2m), from the appropriation under s. 20.395 (5) (dq), the department may expend up to \$500,000 to enter into a contract with an organization to provide professional consulting services related to development of bidder qualifications and the technical requirements of the request for proposals.

Notes: The newly created subsection (4) requires WisDOT to issue an RFP for a new communications system to replace the existing radio system (WISCOM) using the existing sites. It allows the department to hire a consultant to assist with RFP development without soliciting bids or awarding the contract to the lowest responsible bidder. It also allows WisDOT to expend up to \$500,000 to retain the consultant from the appropriation designated for WISCOM support. This appropriation is included as a placeholder since

WisDOT may wish to identify a general program appropriation from which the funds shall be spent.

SECTION 4. REPEAL WIS. STAT. § 323.29(3)(a)2.

Sec. 323.29(3)(a)2. of the statutes is repealed.

Notes: The statute repealed here directed the DMA to issue an RFP for a statewide public safety interoperable communications system during the 2017 biennium. The RFP was issued in October 2018, but subsequently cancelled by the Department of Administration in December 2018. The responsibility for issuing an RFP has been placed with WisDOT per Section 1 above. All remaining provisions regarding the Interoperability Council attached to DMA remain in place because they existed prior to the Council's transfer to DMA in 2017.

(d) Contracts. All contracts entered into by the department of military affairs primarily relating to Next Generation 911, the statewide public safety interoperable communication system, or the interoperability council, as determined by the secretary of administration, in effect on the effective date of this paragraph remain in effect and are transferred to the department of transportation. The department of transportation shall carry out any obligations under those contracts unless modified or rescinded to the extent allowed under the contract.



DMA is also required to develop and operate a statewide public safety interoperable communication system, commonly referred to as WISCOM. To assist DMA in developing the ability of public safety agencies to communicate with each other, there is an interoperability council with a 911 subcommittee attached to DMA. This bill transfers the requirements relating to Next Generation 911 and WISCOM from DMA to DOT and attaches the interoperability council and 911 subcommittee to DOT. The bill also requires DOT to issue a request for proposals for a statewide public safety interoperable communications system to be deployed on existing tower sites and authorizes DOT to spend up to \$500,000 for professional consulting services related to the request for proposals.
