**ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO ASSEMBLY BILL 427**

September 17, 2019 - Offered by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH.

1 **AN ACT** *to renumber and amend* 256.15 (6p); and *to create* 256.15 (6p) (a) and
2 (b) of the statutes; **relating to:** emergency medical services programs.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, an emergency medical services practitioner may act upon a delegation by a health care provider without violating the scope of the emergency medical services practitioner's license. The bill adds conditions that the actions delegated to the emergency medical services practitioner must be all of the following: 1) within the scope of the health care provider's license and competency and 2) delegated to an emergency medical services practitioner whom the health care provider ensures is adequately knowledgeable and trained to perform the delegated action. Current law does not prohibit an emergency medical services program from providing nonemergency services under a delegation.
