

AN ACT to repeal 340.01 (30) (b); to consolidate, renumber and amend 340.01 (30) (intro.) and (a); to amend 70.111 (1), 194.01 (7), 340.01 (29m) (bm), 340.01 (35), 340.01 (74p) (c), 341.05 (23), 346.02 (4) (title) and 346.02 (4) (a); and to create 340.01 (15ph), 346.806, 347.02 (1) (em), 347.489 (3m) and 349.18 (4) of the statutes; relating to: electric bicycles and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill regulates the operation of electric bicycles.

Under current law, a motor bicycle is "a bicycle to which a power unit [that is] not an integral part of the vehicle has been added to permit the vehicle to travel at a speed of not more than 30 miles per hour with a 150-pound rider on a dry, level, hard surface with no wind and having a seat for the operator" or "a 2-wheeled or 3-wheeled vehicle that has fully operative pedals for propulsion by human power and an electric motor of less than 750 watts and that is capable, when powered solely by the motor, of a maximum speed of less than 20 miles per hour with a 170-pound rider on a dry, level, hard surface with no wind." In general, a motor bicycle is subject to the same rules as other bicycles and an operator of a motor bicycle is subject to the same rules and is afforded the same privileges as operators of other bicycles. An operator of a motor bicycle, however, must posses a valid operator's license.

This bill eliminates the second type of motor bicycle and establishes a similar definition for electric bicycle. Unlike an operator of a motor bicycle, however, an operator of an electric bicycle is not required to hold an operator's license.

Under this bill, an electric bicycle is, in general, "a bicycle that is equipped with fully operative pedals for propulsion by human power and an electric motor of less than 750 watts." Electric bicycles are divided into three classes, as follows:

- 1. Class 1 electric bicycles provide assistance only when the rider is pedaling and cease to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.
- 2. Class 2 electric bicycles may be powered solely by the motor and are not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.
- 3. Class 3 electric bicycles provide assistance only when the rider is pedaling and cease to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour.

In general, an electric bicycle is subject to the same rules as other bicycles and an operator of an electric bicycle is subject to the same rules and is afforded the same privileges as operators of other bicycles, with the following exceptions:

- 1. Persons under the age of 16 years may not operate a class 3 electric bicycle.
- 2. A manufacturer or distributor of an electric bicycle must affix a label containing the classification number of the electric bicycle, the speed at which the motor will cease to provide assistance or power, and the wattage of the motor equipped to the electric bicycle.
- 3. For a class 2 electric bicycle, the motor must cease to provide assistance or power when the brakes are applied. For a class 1 or 3 electric bicycle, the motor must cease to provide assistance or power when the rider stops pedaling.

4. A person may not operate a class 3 electric bicycle unless the electric bicycle is equipped with a speedometer.

5) Local authorities may prohibit the operation of electronic bicycles, with the power unit in operation, on certain designated nonmotorized bicycle ways or bicycle paths.

(d) No person may operate a class 3 electric bicycle unless the electric bicycle
is equipped with a speedometer that with reasonable accuracy registers the speed
of the electric bicycle in miles per hour.

349.18 (4) (a) The governing body of a municipality or county may by ordinance
prohibit the operation, with the power unit in operation, of electric bicycles on bicycle

(b) The department of natural resources may promulgate rules prohibiting the operation, with the power unit in operation, of electric bicycles on bicycle ways or bicycle paths under its jurisdiction that are designated nonmotorized and that have a natural surface tread made by clearing and grading the native soil with no added surfacing materials.

Hi Matt,

I think we are super close here. After discussing the natural surface trail language with our industry partners, we think it might be more clear to remove it entirely. We think the general reference to trails would include native soil trails (essentially mountain bike trails) as well as paved and crushed limestone trails. So it should not be necessary to specifically name native soil trails.

Below is what is in the current draft of 346.806 Special rules applicable to electric bicycles. Can you ask LRB to remove the highlighted text and leave the rest of the language as is?

(3) (a) A person may ride, with the power unit in operation, an electric bicycle upon a bicycle way or bicycle path, for a bicycle way or bicycle path under the jurisdiction of the department of natural resources, subject to any restrictions specified in a rule promulgated by the department of natural resources under s.

349.18 (4) (b), or, for a bicycle way or bicycle path under the jurisdiction of a municipality or county, subject to any restrictions specified in an ordinance enacted under s. 349.18 (4) (a)(b) A person may ride, with the power unit in operation, an electric bicycle upon

a bicycle way or bicycle path under the jurisdiction of the department, subject to any restrictions specified in a rule promulgated by the department.

(c) Notwithstanding par. (a), no person may ride, with the power unit in operation, an electric bicycle upon a trail that is designated nonmotorized and that has a natural surface tread made by clearing and grading the native soil with no added surfacing materials.



Hey Matt,

I think we have finally heard from EVERYONE who wanted input on this bill. Two minor issues remain that we would like LRB to consider.

- 1. Definition of bikeway vs bicycle way and path re: WDNR comments from Brigit Brown: "there's a segment re DNR lands that references bike way & bicycle path (Pg 5, section 13 (3) (a)) the statutory definitions of those terms are weird in that <u>Bicycle way</u> technically does not include DNR lands, and bicycle path is not defined. We'd be better off either using <u>Bikeway</u> (though I believe this would include roads (w/o bike lanes) & bike lanes, and I'm not sure if that is intended by this legislation or not) or referencing dept-specific law/code, which would be something like "facility opened to bicycle use under state statute or administrative code". I can reach out to LRB on this. Brigit Brown
- 2. This is even less important, but the draft does not add in the term "electric bicycles" along with other "bicycles" and "motor bicycles." For example, draft legislation does not amend s. 349.18(2), which allows municipalities to require registration, nor s. 347.489, which requires working lights and brakes. I don't know if that's intentional. It's possible the drafters assumed that the term "bicycles" encompasses "electric bicycles."

If you could please just run those comments past the drafter at LRB, we trust their interpretation. We just wanted to be thorough.

Once that is done, let's move this over to Sen. Roth's office and then we can work on getting some more cosponsors and letters of support.



Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill regulates the operation of electric bicycles.

Under current law, a motor bicycle is "a bicycle to which a power unit [that is] not an integral part of the vehicle has been added to permit the vehicle to travel at a speed of not more than 30 miles per hour with a 150-pound rider on a dry, level, hard surface with no wind and having a seat for the operator" or "a 2-wheeled or 3-wheeled vehicle that has fully operative pedals for propulsion by human power and an electric motor of less than 750 watts and that is capable, when powered solely by the motor, of a maximum speed of less than 20 miles per hour with a 170-pound rider on a dry, level, hard surface with no wind." In general, a motor bicycle is subject to the same rules as other bicycles and an operator of a motor bicycle is subject to the same rules and is afforded the same privileges as operators of other bicycles. An operator of a motor bicycle, however, must posses a valid operator's license.

This bill eliminates the second type of motor bicycle and establishes a similar definition for electric bicycle. Unlike an operator of a motor bicycle, however, an operator of an electric bicycle is not required to hold an operator's license.

Under this bill, an electric bicycle is "a bicycle that is equipped with fully operative pedals for propulsion by human power and an electric motor of less than 750 watts." Electric bicycles are divided into three classes, as follows:

- 1. Class 1 electric bicycles provide assistance only when the rider is pedaling and cease to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.
- 2. Class 2 electric bicycles may be powered solely by the motor and are not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.
- 3. Class 3 electric bicycles provide assistance only when the rider is pedaling and cease to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour.


