Following-up on our phone conversation, below is the outline of the seven bills we're looking to get drafted relating to Lyme Disease.

Draft 6: Requiring Signs on Ticks and Lyme Disease on Certain State Properties

- Require signage designed in consultation with DHS to raise awareness of Lyme Disease, inform on how to prevent tick bites, and encouraging visitors to check for ticks after visits to be posted in common areas such as the park entrance, a trailhead, or in a campground in all state parks and forests (at least one sign per property)
 - Provide time for DNR and DHS to post the signs through delayed implementation

Draft 7: Requiring the Sale of Bug Spray at Certain State Properties

- Require the DNR to sell bug spray in all state parks and forests when their park or forest office is open and staffed or require the DNR to create an agreement with a Friends group who has an active presence in parks such as operating a concession stand to sell bug spray when the stand is open and staffed
 - Allow for some flexibility in this mandate in case the Department or Friends group is out of stock or does not have an active presence in the park or forest



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


