This bill allows a person who is licensed by an agricultural agency of another state to take weights and samples of milk in bulk tanks. Current law generally requires a person to hold a license granted by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection to take weights and samples of milk held in a bulk tank on the farm where the milk is produced.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
