Thanks for your work on getting LRBs 1758 and 1759 drafted for us regarding Lyme Disease. We're looking to draft another bill for that package regarding awareness effort requirements on Lyme Disease in the DNR.

Ultimately, the goal of this bill would be to require certain awareness efforts by the DNR in print and digital forms. With regards to the print form, information to raise awareness of Lyme Disease, inform on how to prevent tick bites, and encourage visitors to check for ticks after visiting a State Park shall be published in future informational brochures produced for specific State Parks by the DNR and distributed in Park Offices. This does not include brochures only containing a State Park map, but may include brochures that have a map and other information about the Park or nearby attractions. I don't know if there's a specific way we can word this, but we're not looking to require the DNR to print new materials based on this requirement, but just print this information in future brochures.

In this bill, we would also like to add a requirement for the DNR to complete an annual awareness campaign in May of each year, which is Lyme Disease Awareness Month, on digital platforms including their website, social media, and e-newsletters, and in print circulations including their magazine. The goal of these awareness efforts would be to raise awareness of Lyme Disease, inform on how to prevent tick bites, and encourage people to check for ticks after spending time outdoors. We are looking to leave this requirement fairly wide open to allow the DNR to choose how they shall inform people while still ensuring they undertake these efforts.

On Page 2, line 10, can we make the "shall use digital platforms, including... and print platforms, including..." something along the line of 'shall use <u>some combination of</u> digital platforms, including... and print platforms, including...'. We don't want to require them to use all of those platforms, but require the use of at least some of the platforms and hope they choose to use them all.




