

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Workforce Development to include 16 specific occupational areas, commonly referred to as "career clusters," for the youth apprenticeship program. Under current law, DWD is required to approve and maintain a list of approved career clusters, but is not required to include any specific career cluster.
