March 1, 2019 - Introduced by Senators JACQUE, FEYEN and NASS, cosponsored by Representatives DITTRICH, OLDENBURG, BRANDTJEN, JAMES, MURPHY, MURSAU, NYGREN, RAMTHUN, ROHRKASTE, SKOWRONSKI, STEFFEN, SUMMERFIELD, TITTL and TUSLER. Referred to Committee on Local Government, Small Business, Tourism and Workforce Development.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 106.13 (2m); and *to create* 106.13 (2m) (a) to (p) of the statutes;
2 **relating to:** requiring certain occupational areas to be included in the youth
3 apprenticeship program.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Workforce Development to include 16 specific occupational areas, commonly referred to as “career clusters,” for the youth apprenticeship program. Under current law, DWD is required to approve and maintain a list of approved career clusters, but is not required to include any specific career cluster.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

18 (L) Law, public safety, corrections, and security.

19 (m) Manufacturing.

20 (n) Marketing.

21 (o) Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

22 (p) Transportation, distribution, and logistics.
