This bill allows the Department of Health Services to suspend compliance with current copayment and premium requirements for childless adults and any other conflicting law under the Medical Assistance program in order to satisfy criteria for an enhanced federal medical assistance percentage, or FMAP, during the period for which the enhanced federal medical assistance percentage applies.
