Can you draft a change to the Board of Review timeline under 70.47 to allow Boards of Review to notice an adjournment, rather than meet and then adjourn? We received this suggested language from DOR, that would create a subsection under 70.47(3)(aL):

(aL)(g) If the 2020 assessment roll is not completed at the time during the 45-day period beginning on the 4th Monday of April, the board shall publish a class 1 notice under ch. 985 and proceed under sub. (2) when the roll is complete.

This would be a draft for the GOP April 7 proposal. Let me know if you need anything else or have any questions, happy to try and clarify if needed.
