Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill provides funding for joint programming between the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay and the Oneida Tribe.

Under current law, the Department of Administration must provide funding, from tribal gaming receipts, to finance programming at UW-Green Bay that is jointly developed with the Oneida Tribe. However, current law appropriates no money for this purpose. This bill provides annual funding, from tribal gaming receipts, for this purpose.

This proposed bill increases the dollar amount for fiscal year 2019-20 by \$247,500 and also increases the dollar amount for fiscal year 2020-21 by \$247,500.

The Oneida Nation and University of Wisconsin-Green Bay have a longstanding relationship solidified by various programs and partnerships. Both the Oneida Nation and University of Wisconsin-Green Bay communities view this partnership as a foundational relationship that is imperative to joint success. This relationship is uniquely formalized in Wisconsin State Statute 36.11(43) which reads:

Programming at University of Wisconsin-Green Bay. The board shall ensure that the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay implements programming that is jointly developed by the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay and the Oneida Tribe.
