#### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The courts would be reporting revocations to the department through currently existing processes, so no new systems will need to be built. However, changes to the revocation system would be required to implement this bill costing approximately \$150,800 and six months.

DNR data shows that there were, in the past five years, 25 people who would have qualified for the revocation specified in this bill.

Assuming there are a similar number of convictions in the future, approximately 5 per year, and each of these individuals would reinstate their operating privileges for \$200, the reinstatement fees collected would total \$1,000.

Approximately 43% of the individuals currently revoked for OWI-related offenses obtain an occupational license. This would mean that 2 occupational licenses would likely be issued per year under this bill. This bill would have the department collect \$50 for each occupational license obtained following one of these OWI convictions, resulting in a total collection of approximately \$100 per year.

The total revenue collected by the department under this bill would be approximately \$1,100 per year.

The FTE involved in issuing these occupational licenses would total less than 0.05 FTE.

#### **Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

Continued revenue collection of \$1,100 per year.
