## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2019 SB 277 would require that all specifications for highway improvements prepared by the Department for highway improvements within its jurisdiction include an encouragement to use, in the highway improvement, materials sourced from within the right-of-way of the proposed highway improvement. The bill would also specify that Department could not charge for any materials sourced from within the right-of-way and that bidders could include those potential cost savings in their bids. Under the bill, bidders would be responsible for any unanticipated costs in sourcing alternate materials if the materials proposed to be sourced from within the right-of-way would not satisfy the applicable specifications for the highway improvement or are more costly to utilize than anticipated, or if the bidders fail to receive all necessary approvals, other than the approval of the Department, to excavate or remove the materials.

As project circumstances allow, the Department currently allows bidders to propose the use of materials sourced from within the right-of-way, such as aggregate, for a fee. Under the bill, DOT would not be able to assess such fees. Instead, bidders could include any potential savings to the project cost into their bid. The effect of these provisions on state costs is indeterminate.
