#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to create (design, produce), and post (ship and install, within six months of the effective date) at least one sign at each state park, state trail, state recreation area, and state forest regarding Lyme disease. The signs are to be created in consultation with the Department of Health Services and are to inform about how to prevent tick bites and to encourage people to check for ticks. In addition, the bill provides one-time funding of \$12,500 in FY 2020 for this purpose.

#### State Fiscal Effect

A minimum of 115 signs would need to be created and posted to comply with the provisions of the bill—one sign each at 49 state parks, 43 state trails, 8 state recreation areas, and 15 state forests.

One-time costs to implement the bill are estimated at \$12,500 and are itemized as follows:

- a. \$1,000 of LTE staff time to design the signs (graphic design, consultation with Health Services)
- b. \$9,000 to produce 230 signs (two per property to account for vandalism, multiple signs for large properties, etc.)
- c. \$250 shipping costs
- d. \$2,250 of LTE staff time and supplies for installation
