## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under this bill, the Department of Health Services will establish a grant program to award \$500,000 GPR to public, private, and tribal elementary and secondary schools for purchasing choking rescue devices. A grant applicant must submit an application to the Department outlining protocols for the use of and plans for providing training on the use of the choking rescue devices to be purchased with the grant. Grant recipients must contribute matching funds equal to at least 25 percent of the total grant. No such program currently exists within the Department.

To satisfy the requirements of the bill, the Department estimates the workload will result in a one-time cost of \$64,300 GPR to support a 1.0 LTE contract specialist-advanced. This position will be responsible for developing and administering the grant program. The Department is unable to absorb these costs under existing resources.

In sum, the total fiscal effect is a one-time cost of \$564,300 GPR.
