Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Counties are responsible for responding to individuals experiencing a mental health or substance abuse crisis. Crisis response often takes the form of services provided to the individual within their community, but in some cases, the individual undergoes emergency detention at an inpatient facility, including the Winnebago Mental Health Institute.

This bill creates a new appropriation in FY 21 to award \$5,000,000 GPR to five regional crisis stabilization facilities for adults. The bill requires DHS to establish criteria for facilities to receive the grants, establish five regions based on the need for crisis stabilization services, and to award grants to each region in an equal amount. The bill does not provide funding to support the administration of the program. To administer the program, the Department will expend workload related to establishing criteria for the facilities, preparing the grant funding announcement, assessing responses, developing contracts with the facilities, and providing ongoing monitoring and technical assistance to the awardees. DHS will use existing resources to address the workload.

The impact of the regional crisis stabilization facilities on WMHI admissions and county costs is unknown at this time. Establishing regional facilities to provide crisis services could result in reduced admissions and program revenue at WMHI. However, any changes to WMHI admissions are not expected to be significant enough to reduce staffing or capacity at WMHI, and should not significantly affect WMHI's costs. The impact on county costs will depend on the locations of the facilities, the number of individuals diverted from WMHI and into the regional crisis facilities, differences between WMHI's rates and the facilities' rates, and any differences in county transportation costs between the facilities.

The Department expects the bill to cost \$5,000,000 GPR in FY 21.
